READ Acts 17:26-27 26

From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. 27 God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us.

How does it make you feel to know that God has made you on purpose, for a purpose?

Do you often think about how God has specifically placed you in time and space so that people can know Christ?

READ 2 Corinthians 5:18-20

18 All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: 19 that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. 20 We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God.

Do you think of yourself as an ambassador of Christ to your community?

Can you think of five people that God has placed near you in time and space, who you can pray for and invite into the message of Jesus?
