# Question #1

### Matthew 6:21, NIV

#### **Question #5**

Paul encourages the Corinthians to not give up in their "grace of giving" (see 2 Corinthians 8:1-15). Randy says this is a great way to put it, because it frames giving as a gift. Do you always think of giving to others as a gift to yourself? If not, what are your thoughts on this perspective?

#### **Question #6**

Read Mark 10:43-45 below. Why do you think Randy says this passage describes "the very opposite of being a narcissist?"

#### Mark 10:43-45, NIV

"Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, <sup>44</sup> and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. <sup>45</sup> For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
